11 Highlanders Named to All-Division Teams

(BERKELEY HEIGHTS) – 11 members of this year's Governor Livingston football team were named to the BCC All-United Silver Division First & Second Teams.

David Dorsett, OT/DT, Sr. – 1st Team All-Division

This is Dorsett's second career All-Division selection after a second team selection in 2025. Dorsett was a team captain and a three-year starter at offensive tackle, defensive end, and long snapper. Offensively, Dorsett teamed with guard Max DiDonato to form an impenetrable left side of the offensive line. Defensively, facing regular double teams, Dorsett still registered 50 total tackles, 1 sack, 4 pass breakups, and a team-leading 16.5 tackles for loss.

Max DiDonato, OG/ILB, Sr. - 1st Team All-Division

This is DiDonato's first career All-Division selection. DiDonato was a team captain and a four-year varsity starter at left guard. In addition to his stellar offensive line play, DiDonato took over the Mike linebacker spot, after spot duty defensively last season. DiDonato turned in a strong performance with a team-leading 94 total tackles. He also had 8.5 tackles for loss, 1 sack, and 1 fumble recovery.

John Cole, OG/DT, Sr. – 1st Team All-Division

This is Cole's first career All-Division selection. A team captain, Cole took over at right guard halfway through his junior season, stabilizing the right side of the offensive line and paving the way for an offense that averaged 175.2 rushing yards per game. While inflicting devastation with his strong run blocking, Cole also saw some defensive duty in the last few games of the season, highlighted by a forced fumble in the division-clinching win over New Brunswick.

Mark Capparelli, DE, Sr. – 1st Team All-Division

This is Capparelli's first career All-Division selection. After returning to football for the first time since PAL, Capparelli solidified the defensive end position opposite David Dorsett. Capparelli led all defensive linemen with 64 total tackles and also registered 12 tackles for loss, 2 forced fumbles, 1 blocked kick, 1 pass breakup, and a team-leading 2.5 sacks.

Julio Nieto, OLB, Sr. – 1st Team All-Division

This is Nieto's first career All-Division selection. After splitting time to start the season, Nieto grabbed hold of the Stud linebacker position. Nieto tallied 54 total tackles, 9.5 tackles for loss, 3 pass breakups, and 1 forced fumble. He also had the fumble recovery and return touchdown that provided that winning margin in the season-ending win over Metuchen.

Sean Seccamanie, DT, Sr. – 1st Team All-Division

This is Seccamanie's second career All-Division selection after a second team selection in 2025. A team captain, Seccamanie registered 30 total tackles, 3 tackles for loss, and 2

fumble recoveries while controlling the A gap defensively. In addition, Seccamanie got on the score offensively, courtesy of a 2-yard touchdown run in the division-clinching win over New Brunswick.

Joey Switlyk, C, Jr. - 1st Team All-Division

This is Switlyk's first career All-Division selection. Switlyk stepped in as the starting senior after Week 3 of his sophomore season. He is now the anchor of an offensive line that averaged 175.2 rushing yards per game while routinely taking on larger defensive linemen.

Elijah Garcia, RB/CB, So. - 1st Team All-Division

This is Garcia's first career All-Division selection. Garcia led the Highlanders with 806 rushing yards on 130 carries, a 6.2 yards per carry average, and 8 rushing touchdowns. Garcia also added a receiving touchdown, along with 7 receptions for 55 yards. Garcia also saw time defensively at cornerback, registering 24 total tackles and 3 pass breakups.

Logan Stack, ILB, Jr. - 2nd Team All-Division

This is Stack's first career All-Division selection. Stack won the preseason competition for the vacant Will linebacker spot and finished second on the team with 79 total tackles. Stack also had 3 tackles for loss and 1 fumble recovery.

Theo Tombros, OT/DT, Jr. – 2nd Team All-Division

This is Tombros's first career All-Division selection. Tombros started three games a sophomore, filling in for an injured David Dorsett. This year, Tombros claimed the starting right tackle job opposite Dorsett while also seeing time defensively. Tombros tallied 12 total tackles while rotating at both defensive tackle and defensive end.

Parker Chatfield, WR/FS, So. – 2nd Team All-Division

This is Chatfield's first career All-Division selection. After appearing a situational target last season, Chatfield stepped into a starting role at one of the outside receiver spots, leading the team with 15 receptions for 157 yards and 1 touchdown. At free safety, Chatfield played a strong center field, registering 30 tackles, 1 pass breakup, and 3 interceptions.
